As you begin your journey with us, I would like to introduce you to University Centre Leeds' support for care experienced and estranged students. Our dedicated team are here to offer you advice and support from the moment you start with us, all the way to your graduation.

We understand that care-experienced and estranged students often face unique challenges as they start their higher education studies. Without proper support, these challenges can make it difficult for students to apply for, enter and remain in higher education. That's why we work directly with students to address these challenges and provide the necessary support to ensure that every student feels like University Centre Leeds is a supportive place to study.

At UC Leeds, we have always been committed to creating an inclusive environment, and this approach continues to this day. We have committed our support to estranged students through the Stand Alone Pledge, and we continue to work with the Care Leaver Covenant to further improve our support provision. We are here to support you every step of the way, and I wish you all the best as you begin your studies at University Centre Leeds.

Definitions

Care Experienced

A care experienced student or care leaver has been in the care of, or been given accommodation by, their local authority (LA) for a period of at least 13 weeks before the age of 16, and hasn't reconciled with their parents between leaving care and starting their course.

Estranged Student

An estranged student is aged 25 or under and has been classified as an independent student on the grounds of estrangement by Student Finance. Estranged students are young people studying without the support of a family network, usually due to a long-term breakdown in the relationship with their parents or guardians.



Support at a glance

We have a dedicated contact for care experienced and estranged students, so that you have a point of contact both before you get here and during your studies.

If you have indicated on your UCAS form that you are a care experienced or estranged student, our key contact will automatically be in touch with you. However, you can also contact the team at any time if you have any questions or concerns relating to university life.

We can:

- help with any further questions you may have about our courses and what it's like to study at UC Leeds
- act as a link between you and your local authority
- act as a guarantor for your student accommodation agreements
- facilitate a tailored visit to your campus where we will meet you and discuss what support will be available to you
- meet with you when you start your course
- offer emotional and practical support throughout your studies and direct you to other appropriate services
- offer you tailored budgeting advice that will help you manage your money effectively and meet your essential costs, while still being able to enjoy yourself!

We recognise that you may not want to tell anyone else at the university centre that you are a care experienced or an estranged student. This information will be kept confidential and will only be shared if you give consent to share.

Funding your studies

Most UK students fund the cost of higher education with a tuition fee loan and a maintenance loan from Student Finance. Care experienced and estranged students can get the same support as other students, but your application won't be based on your parent's income. <u>www.gov.uk/student-finance</u>


For care experienced students

Student Finance will consider a student care experienced if they have been in the care of, or have been given accommodation by, their local authority (LA) for at least 13 weeks before the age of 16. After you have made your application online, Student Finance will ask you to send evidence showing that you were looked after by, or were given accommodation by, your LA.

For estranged students

Student Finance will consider a student estranged if they are permanently estranged from their parents or have not communicated with them for one year before starting their studies. After you have made your application online, Student Finance will request supporting statements from trusted independent parties (such as a teacher, social worker, police officer or GP) as evidence to confirm your estranged status.

The charity StandAlone supports people that are estranged from family. They have a useful Student Support Portal (see URL below) with advice on applying to Student Finance as a care experienced or estranged student. <u>www.standalone.org.uk/students</u>



Financial support

We offer specific financial support for care experienced and estranged students which includes:

- Supporting the cost of interview travel and/or on-course materials (where applicable up to 50% of costs)
- A yearly bursary (more info below)
- Supporting the cost of graduation gown hire and photographs (up to 50% of costs)

Care Leavers' Bursary / Estranged Students' Bursary

Our bursary offers up to £1,000 per year, on top of any other bursaries or awards you have already secured. To be eligible, we ask for the same evidence you will need to provide to Student Finance England, and applications open in September. You will receive an email with further information.

There is also financial support available to all students (including care experienced and estranged students) including:

University Centre Leeds Bursary

The University Centre Leeds Bursary provides students with a cash bursary of up to £500 per academic year if they have had their income assessed by Student Finance. For more information, please visit <u>ucleeds.ac.uk/fees-finance/bursary/</u>

Hardship Fund

The Hardship Fund aims to support students who find themselves in financial difficulties. The fund is intended to act as a safety net for those in need and can help alleviate unexpected financial hardship.



StandAlone are an organisation who support people of all ages that have become estranged or disowned from their family or key family member. They run support groups, provide information and advice online and lead on research in this field.
