1. POLICY STATEMENT

University Centre Leeds will operate a system for assuring the formal arrangement for student engagement and partnership, in the management of quality enhancement and assurance.

University Centre Leeds has a firm commitment to:

- Ensuring that its processes for engaging with students allow sufficient opportunity for students to provide feedback;
- Providing mechanisms for the management of quality and standards through student engagement and partnership;
- Providing all students with the opportunity to make their views on their educational experience known to University Centre Leeds, and that these opportunities are made known to students.

2. POLICY AIMS/OBJECTIVES

This policy applies to the commitment of University Centre Leeds and the Students' Union to work together in the management of the quality enhancement and assurance of the Higher Education provision offered by University Centre Leeds. This includes a coherent and systematic approach to student representation at all levels of within University Centre Leeds.

Its purpose is to ensure that the HE Student Engagement policy and procedures are implemented consistently across University Centre Leeds and that students are active partners in their learning and in defining the academic and strategic direction of University Centre Leeds. In addition, the HE Student Engagement policy and procedures are fully informed by the requirements of awarding bodies and the revised QAA Quality Code for Higher Education, in particular the Advice and Guidance relating to Student Engagement.

University Centre Leeds encourages the views of students, individually and collectively, in informing quality systems with the purpose of improving the student educational experience both for current and future cohorts. The delivery and development of all aspects of the student educational experience can be positively influenced by student engagement.

Student Representation	 University Centre Leeds will be committed to developing academic communities characterised by mutual respect between staff and students. University Centre Leeds will develop academic communities which draw on the expertise and experience of both staff and students to reflect on and enhance the quality of the educational opportunities University Centre Leeds offers. University Centre Leeds will ensure the formal arrangement and management of student engagement through student representation and elected HE Student Representatives. Programme teams are responsible for overseeing the nomination and election of HE Student Representatives and to notify HE Registry of the name of the elected student(s). HE Registry will ensure that HE Student Representatives are provided with the appropriate HE Student Representative handbook, training, guidance and support as seen as necessary to fulfill the role of HE Student Representative. HE Student Representatives will represent the collective voice of students within their group (compliments, comments and concerns), to

	 University Centre Leeds staff, HE Registry, QAA and validating partners. This will involve the attendance and participation in meetings. University Centre Leeds will ensure that activities relating to student representation do not make disproportionate demands on the time of students. HE Student Representatives will act in the role of liaison, providing a link between staff and students. Lead HE Student Representatives will provide support and/or mentorship for HE Student Representatives, support in the organisation of focus groups and feedback gathering, and support the development of student-led peer/community groups. 	
	University Centre Leeds will make students fully aware of the student ambassador scheme, whereby current students will work in partnership with HE Registry to facilitate outreach and other activities for potential or new students.
